

ST TERESA BENEDICTA OF THE

CROSS: Born Edith Stein, St Teresa was a Jewess who was a brilliant philosopher who studied under Edmund Husserl in Germany. After her doctorate Edith continued teaching and writing. She became a Roman Catholic and eventually a Carmelite, taking her new name. During World War Two she was moved to the Netherlands for her own safety. However, because the Dutch bishops issued a letter criticizing the Nazi regime's persecution of Jews, all Catholics of Jewish descent were rounded up there. Sr Teresa was taken to Auschwitz and murdered. She was beatified as a martyr in 1987 and later declared a "Co-Patron of Europe". St Teresa, pray for us.
