DILEXI TE: Here is our final extract from Pope Leo's exhortation, "Dilexi Te" ("I have loved you"):

I would like to close by saying something about almsgiving, which nowadays is not looked upon favorably even among believers. Not only is it rarely practiced, but it is even at times disparaged. Let me state once again that the most important way to help the disadvantaged is to assist them in finding a good job, so that they can lead a more dignified life by developing their abilities and contributing their fair share. In this sense, "lack of work means far more than simply not having a steady source of income. Work is also this, but it is much, much more.

By working we become a fuller person, our humanity flourishes, young people become adults only by working. The Church's social doctrine has always seen human work as a participation in God's work of creation that continues every day, also thanks to the hands, mind and heart of the workers."

On the other hand, where this is not possible, we cannot risk abandoning others to the fate of lacking the necessities for a dignified life. Consequently, almsgiving remains, for the time being, a necessary means of contact, encounter and empathy with those less fortunate....

Both the Old and New Testaments contain veritable hymns in praise of almsgiving: "Be patient with someone in humble circumstances, and do not keep him waiting for your alms... Store up almsgiving in your treasury, and it will rescue you from every disaster" (Sir 29:8,12)..... Saint John Chrysostom is known for saying: Let us then show Jesus mercy in the persons of the poor and those who today are lying on the ground, so that when we come to leave this world they may receive us into everlasting dwelling places."

(Perhaps this Advent we might consider giving alms to Shelter, the Passage, the Salvation Army, the Food Bank, Age UK, or other organizations caring for the poorest in our society).
